We talk about our homes and families. I realize then that nothing separates us-- not skin color, not our birth place, not our social standing, nor our political views or religious beliefs. Even in this corner of the world, people want to be loved and accepted. They want peace, they want joy, they want to dream.”

We have accomplished much in little time. Yet, there is much more to do and many more people to awaken to the needs of the poor and homeless.

We look forward to growing by leaps and bounds and have representation in every corner of the globe in the next few years. Our hope is that future generations will hold on to and expand on the ideal of advocating volunteerism. We look to today's youth and already



see promise that they will effect positive change, bring hope and leave marks of love for others to follow.
